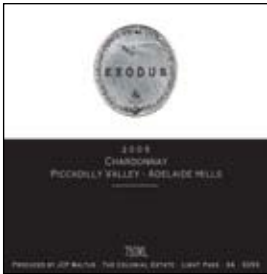

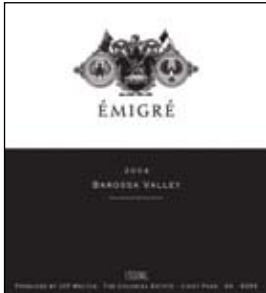
2005 “Exodus” Chardonnay

94pts “Pale gold. Gorgeous aromas of tangerine, white peach, nectarine, iodine, pine nut, jasmine and fennel, with a lush buttery overlay and hints of stone, flowers and lees; this could easily pass for high-end Meursault. Spicy, focused and vibrant, but also possesses serious weight and a chewy texture. The lush pear, peach and buttery anise flavors expand and deepen on the extremely long finish, with a late snap of minerality bringing things into sharp focus. Major-league, superconcentrated Australian chardonnay, one of the two best I tried this year along with the 2004 from Giaconda.” *Stephen Tanzer’s International Wine Cellar, August 2006*



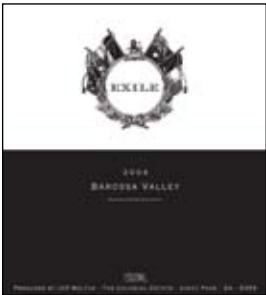
2004 “Émigré”

94pts “The 2004 Emigre, a Rhone-based blend of Grenache, Shiraz, and Mourvedre as well as Carignan and Cabernet Sauvignon, exhibits a sweet perfume of graphite, black fruits, sweet cherries, licorice, smoke, and background vanillin. Full-bodied, rich, textured, and impressively long, it should drink well for 10-15 years ... minimum.” *Robert Parker’s The Wine Advocate, October 2006*



2004 “Exile”

96pts “The single vineyard 2004 Exile is fashioned from a northern Barossa Shiraz vineyard. A stunning, 100% new French oak-aged blend of 85% Shiraz and the rest primarily Mourvedre, it is a wine of extraordinary intensity as well as aromatic purity. Blackberry, espresso roast, scorched earth, and flower characteristics are found in this full-bodied yet elegant, well-defined effort. It should drink beautifully for 10-15 years.” *Robert Parker’s The Wine Advocate, October 2006*

2005 "Expatrie" Reserve Semillon

90pts "The 2005 Expatrie is a blend of 85% Semillon and 15% Riesling, the latter providing a zesty character. It offers notions of buttered citrus, sealing wax, and tropical fruit along with wonderful intensity and richness as well as a dry, full-bodied style. It will drink well for several years." *Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate, October 2006*



2004 "Envoy" GSM

91pts "The deep ruby/purple-tinged 2004 Envoy GSM is a blend of 50% Grenache, 30% Shiraz, and 20% Mourvedre. Its elegant, complex perfume of peppery black currant and cherry fruit, loamy soil, resinous pine forest, and meaty aromas is followed by a complex, elegant yet substantial red to consume over the next 5-6 years." *Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate, October 2006*



2004 "Evangéliste" Reserve Chardonnay

88pts "I tasted three Chardonnays, including the excellent 2004 Evangéliste Chardonnay Reserve, which does not see any malolactic fermentation, but is aged in 50-70% wood. It is an attractive, medium-bodied, solidly made effort. It should be consumed during its first 2-3 years of life." *Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate, October 2006*



2004 "Etranger" Cabernet Sauvignon

90pts "Jonathan Maltus certainly knows his Bordeaux varietals, as evidenced by the impressive 2004 Cabernet Sauvignon l'Etranger, a dense ruby/purple-hued effort boasting plenty of black currant, earth, and spice notes. Rich and full-bodied, with sweet tannin, a voluptuous mouthfeel, and a long finish, it should drink well for 7-8 years." *Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate, October 2005*



2005 "Enchanteur" Rosé

90pts "Brilliant bright pink. Mineral-tinged, floral bouquet of wild strawberry, raspberry, blood orange and, yes, rose. Fresh and bright but also powerful, with excellent concentration and focus to the bright red berry flavors. Fine, dusty and precise on the finish, offering excellent balance and understated sweetness." *Stephen Tanzer's International Wine Cellar, August 2006*



2004 "Explorateur" Shiraz

92pts "The 2004 Shiraz l'Explorateur's opaque ruby/purple color is accompanied by an opulent, creamy mouthfeel, sweet tannin, loads of richness and concentration, and a heady, smooth finish. This velvety-textured, character-filled Shiraz should drink well for a decade." *Robert Parker's The Wine Advocate, October 2005*



TO BE RELEASED LATER THIS YEAR:

2005 The Colonial Estate "John Speke" GSM

96pts The compelling 2005 GSM John Speke's blue/purple color is accompanied by gorgeous aromas of graphite, camphor, blueberries, blackberries, and acacia flowers. Dense, full-bodied, and rich, with extraordinary purity and precision, it was aged completely in French oak. It should drink well for 10-15 years.

2005 The Colonial Estate "Mungo Park" Shiraz

92pts The 2005 Shiraz Mungo Park (from 80-year old vines) boasts an inky/ruby/purple color, lovely earthy, smoky, peppery, blackberry, and

cassis fruit, a dense, full-bodied palate, wonderful opulence and richness, sweet tannin, and fine length. This stunner should age beautifully for 1-2 decades.

2005 The Colonial Estate "Alexander Laing" Old Vine Grenache

94pts The dark ruby/purple-tinged 2005 Old Vine Grenache Alexander Laing (from 80- to 100-year-old vines) offers damp earth-like notes intermixed with scents of kirsch liqueur, licorice, and pepper. This wine explodes at the back of the palate after a subtle and restrained attack. With a huge finish as well as loads of richness and extract, it should drink well during its first decade of life. *Robert Parker, The Wine Advocate, Issue 167, October 2006.*
